In the framework of the Digital Single Market strategy, cybersecurity is more than ever at the forefront of the European debate. The European Union will have to find trade-offs between competing demands such as a high degree of security versus user convenience when addressing cybersecurity in EU sectorial policies. This includes migration and home affairs (security of eID documents), payment services (PSDII), eGovernment (eGovernment action plan 2016-2020) and telecom sector (ePrivacy Regulation).

Concrete cases will be used for the debate such as Mobile ID, speakers from EU institutions and from the private sector will share their expertise.

SPEAKERS



MICHAŁ BONI

Member of the European Parliament, EPP, Poland

Michał Boni is a Member of the European Parliament since 2014 as part of the European People's Party. He is the Vice-Chair of the delegation to the EU-Moldova Parliamentary Association Committee. He is a member of the Committee on Civil Liberties, Justice and Home Affairs and Delegation to the Euronest Parliamentary Assembly. He is also a substitute at the Committee on Industry, Research and Energy and the Delegation to the EU-Ukraine Parliamentary Association Committee. He has been involved in Polish politics in the 'Solidarity' underground movement since 1980 for which he has been a member of the national authorities since 1989. He became Chairman of the Mazowsze Region Management Board in 1990. He has held various ministerial posts in the Polish government such as Minister of Administration and Digitisation of Poland and Minister of Labour and Social Policy. He was Head of Strategic Advisors to the Prime Minister Donald Tusk from 2008. He holds a PhD from the University of Warsaw and has lectured in the Department of Polish Culture for many years.



DITA CHARANZOVÁ

Member of the European Parliament, ALDE, Czech Republic

Dita Charanzova was elected a Member of the European Parliament from the Czech Republic from the ALDE Group. She was previously Media Box Manager during the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe in Strasbourg. She also covered international trade policy for the Czech Permanent Representation in Brussels. She is a graduate in International Trade and International Politics from the University of Economics in Prague.



SIR JULIAN KING

Commissioner for the Security Union

Sir Julian King is the British Commissioner at the Security Union since 19 September 2016 after he was nominated by David Cameron to succeed Jonathan Hill and after the approval of the European Parliament and the Council of the European Union. He was prior to this Her Majesty's Ambassador to the French Republic in succession to Sir Peter Ricketts from February to September 2016. Sir Julian King has served as Director-General Economic & Consular at the Foreign and Commonwealth Office from 2014 to 2016. Previous to this post, Julian was Director General of the Northern Ireland Office from November 2011 to June 2014, and was Ambassador to Ireland from 2009 to 2011. From 2008 to 2009 he worked in the European Commission as the Head of Office of the British Commissioner. He has served in a number of posts (Brussels, New York, Paris, Luxembourg, The Hague and Lisbon) as well as in London. He was appointed CMG (Order of St Michael and St George) in 2006 and CVO (Royal Victorian Order) in 2011, following the historic first state visit to Ireland by Her Majesty the Queen. He holds a degree from the Ecole Nationale d'Administration (ENA) in France.



PATRICK MONTLIAUD

Executive Vice President Business Unit e-Documents Imprimerie Nationale

Patrick Montliaud joined the Imprimerie Nationale in 2009. Prior to this, Patrick Montliaud had been with Thales and Thomson, working in the field of B-to-B professional systems. He held a wide variety of positions in management, sales management and subsidiary management in France and abroad. Patrick Montliaud graduated as a civil engineer from the Ecole des Mines.



ANDREA SERVIDA

Director for Digital Society trust and cybersecurity - European Commission

Andrea Servida, Head of Unit “eGovernment and Trust”, European Commission, DG CONNECT, leads the team in charge of the European eGovernment Action Plan 2016-2020 as well as of rolling out of the eIDAS Regulation on electronic identification and trust services for electronic transactions in the Internal Market. Before joining the European Commission in 1993, he worked in industry for nearly eight years as a project manager of international R&D projects on decision support systems for environmental, civil and industrial emergency and risk management. He graduated with Laude in Nuclear Engineering at Politecnico di Milano and carried out PhD studies on fuzzy sets and artificial intelligence at Queen Mary and Westfield College, University of London.



FRANCES ROBINSON

Former correspondent of Wall Street Journal and Dow Jones

Frances Robinson is a freelance journalist based in London covering subjects from Brexit to night trains. She previously spent four years at the Wall Street Journal in Brussels covering the EU institutions, tech and telecoms regulation, and Belgium. She covered the advent of the EU Data Protection Regulation, mobile spectrum auctions and events like Mobile World Congress. It also involved everything from features on the future of Belgian fries to doorstepping ECOFIN meetings. Her radio and TV appearances include Sky News, RTBF, CNBC, and the BBC World Service, and she has a wide experience of moderating panels for clients including the OECD, Google and Microsoft. She is a contributor to Politico, The Spectator and the Evening Standard Londoner’s Diary.



LUUKAS KRISTJAN ILVES

Estonian Permanent Representation to the EU

Luukas Kristjan Ilves is Counsellor for Digital Affairs at Estonia’s Permanent Representation to the EU, where he makes Europe a more connected and innovative continent by bringing Estonia’s outcome-oriented experience in digital markets and government to bear on Brussels. He is responsible for preparing Estonia’s ICT policy agenda for its EU Presidency in 2017. Luukas Kristjan Ilves has previously served as Head of International relations for RIA (Estonia’s central agency for e-government and cybersecurity), where he lead Estonia’s push to integrate its e-government systems with neighbouring countries and the EU. He has also worked as a policy planner in the Estonian Ministry of Defence, and as a national expert at the European Commission (in the Cabinet of VP Neelie Kroes). Luukas is a graduate of Stanford University and a reserve officer in the Estonian Defence Forces.



JENS BENDER

German national cybersecurity authority BSI

Jens Bender, mathematician, works as Head of Section “eID Technologies and Smart Cards” at the German Federal Office for Information Security (BSI). Having joined the BSI in 2007, he was involved in the concepts, design and security specifications of the new German electronic identity card. Jens represents the BSI in working groups of national and international standardization bodies (DIN, CEN, ISO), international governmental bodies related to eID-Cards and electronic passports, as well as in the eIDAS regulation Expert Group.

HUBERT PUJOL

French national cybersecurity authority ANSSI

After his PhD in electronics, Hubert Pujol worked in the automatic subway domain and especially in safety computers and systems. Then he worked for the GIE Cartes Bancaires, the French payment card systems where he was involved in the enhancement of Point of Sale security and their certification. For this project, he participated in Europe to the Single Euro Payments Area (SEPA) set up. He is working in ANSSI since 7 years, first in the National Certification Center, where he continued to participate to the Point of Sale security and their certification. Since years he works closely with BSI for Passport standardization, eIDAS token, certification and normalization. As a member of the eIDAS Expert Group, he participated to the elaboration of the eIDAS implementing acts and, in ANSSI, to the reference documents for the French supervisory.



DETLEF HOUDEAU

Spokerperson of the focus group “Secure Mobile Identification”, Germany

Detlef Houdeau is the Senior Director for Business Development in the government Identification (ID) market segment under the Chip Card & Security ICs (Integrated Circuits) business group in Infineon Technologies AG. As the senior director of Business Development based in Germany, Houdeau is responsible for worldwide sales, customers and partners in the ID segment. The projects include combinations of IT security, biometric systems, digital signature, infrastructure systems for issuing ID card and e-passport. Houdeau is active in the Smart Card and ID industry and participates in the following industry organizations: Convenor of EUROSMART, working group CDI in Brussels – the Voice of the Smart Card industry in Europe; Member of SILICON TRUST, London; Head of the expert committee, of the German Association for Information Technology, Telecommunications and New Media (BITKOM), Berlin; Member of IUNO, national reference project on Industry 4.0 & Security in Germany; Chairman of the Program Committee of WORLD-eID Conference; Member of the Program Committee of OMNISECURE; and Expert for public funding programs in the security domain from EC (e.g. FP7, HORIZON 2020).
