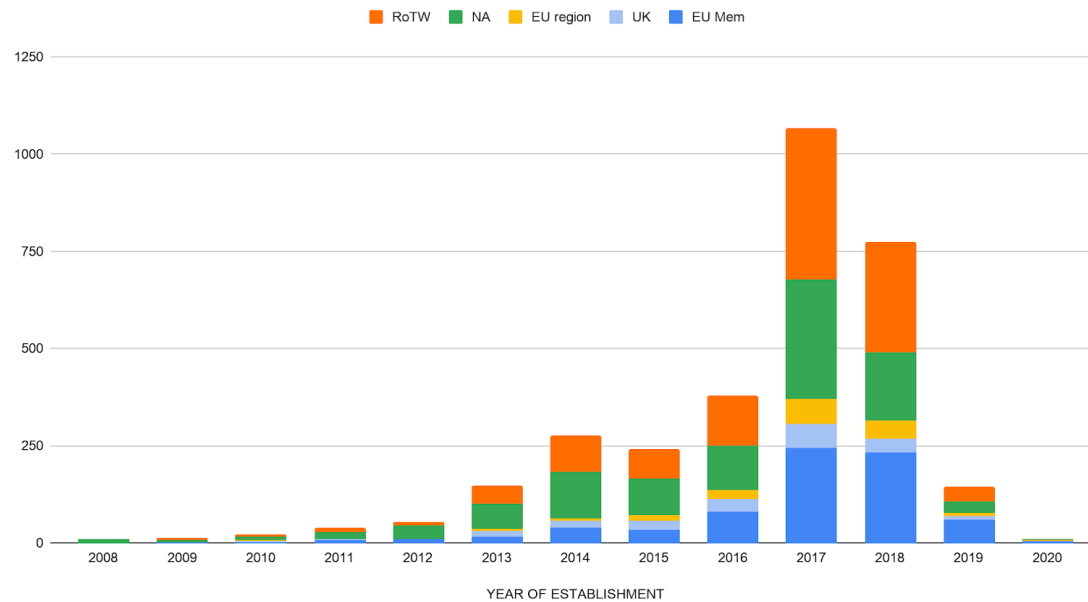

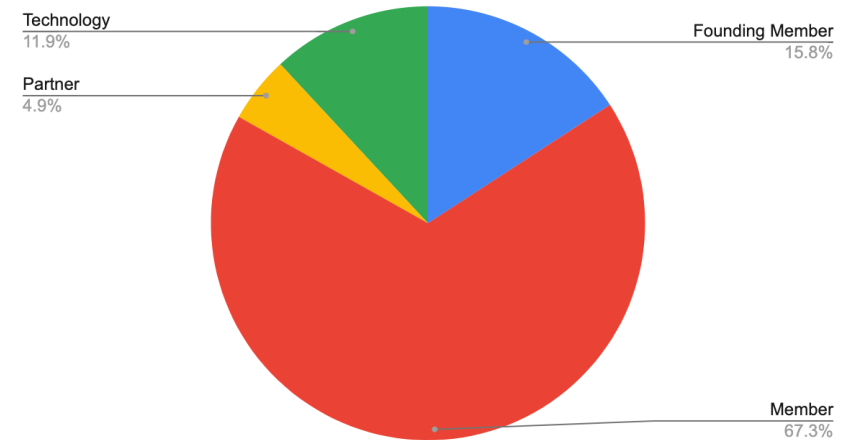
Standardization & Interoperability Are Critical

Lack of standards and interoperability = no massive adoption for new projects

(ISO, CEN-CENELEC, ETSI, ITU, ...) to provide exchange, recommendations, papers and other areas of standardization for consistent future frameworks.

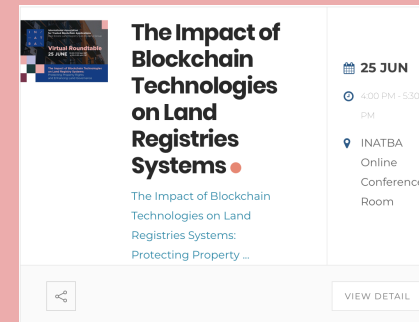
